The Gallup World Poll consists of more than 100 global questions as well as region-specific items. It includes the following global indexes: law and order, food and shelter, institutions and infrastructure, **Emotions** good jobs, wellbeing, and brain gain.

### **Global report[68] (by Gallup**

The Gallup Global Emotions 2024 report offers a snapshot of Gallup’s latest measurements of people’s positive and negative daily experiences. The findings are based on nearly 146,000 interviews with adults aged 15 and older in 142 countries and areas in 2023. POSITIVE EXPERIENCE INDEX QUESTIONS

- Did you feel well-rested yesterday?
- Were you treated with respect all day yesterday?
- Did you smile or laugh a lot yesterday?
- Did you learn or do something interesting yesterday?
- Did you experience the following feelings during a lot of the day yesterday? How about enjoyment?

The Positive Experience Index score is the mean of all valid affirmative responses to these items multiplied by 100. Country-level index scores range from zero to 100. Higher scores indicate that positive emotions are more pervasive in a country. These scores strongly relate to people's perceptions of their living standards, personal freedoms and the presence of social networks.



The Negative Experience Index score is the mean of all valid affirmative responses to the above items multiplied by 100. Country-level index scores range from zero to 100. The higher the score, the more pervasive negative emotions are in a country. People's experiences with health problems and their ability to afford food are predictive of higher negative scores.

# World Happiness Report 2024

## United Nations

### **How Persons Report Their Level of Happiness: Measuring Subjective Well-Being:**

The United Nation's Happiness Report measurement of subjective well-being relies on three main well-being indicators:

life evaluations,  
positive emotions, and  
negative emotions .

The happiness rankings are based on life evaluations, as the more stable measure of the quality of people's lives.

#### **Individual Life evaluations.**

The Gallup World Poll, is the principal source of data in the report. The Poll asks respondents to evaluate their current life on a scale of 10. The best possible life for them as a 10 and worst possible as a 0.

Around 1,000 responses are gathered annually for each country. Weights are used to construct population-representative national averages for each year in each country.

Happiness rankings are based on a three-year average of these life evaluations, since the larger sample size enables more precise estimates.

**Positive emotions.** Positive affect is given by the average of individual yes or no answers about three emotions: laughter, enjoyment, and interest (for details see Technical Box 2).

**Negative emotions.** Negative affect is given by the average of individual yes or no answers about three emotions: worry, sadness, and anger.

#### **Comparing life evaluations and emotions:**

- Life evaluations provide the most informative measure for international comparisons because they capture quality of life in a more complete and stable way than emotional reports based on daily experiences.


- Life evaluations are better explained by the diverse life experiences in different countries. The United Nations Happiness report shows in a chapter that emotions are significant supports for life evaluations.

## Country Rankings by Life Evaluations in 2021-2023


















## Program for International Student Assessment 2022 (Overall Pisa Score)




## Program for International Student Assessment 2022 (Math Score)








